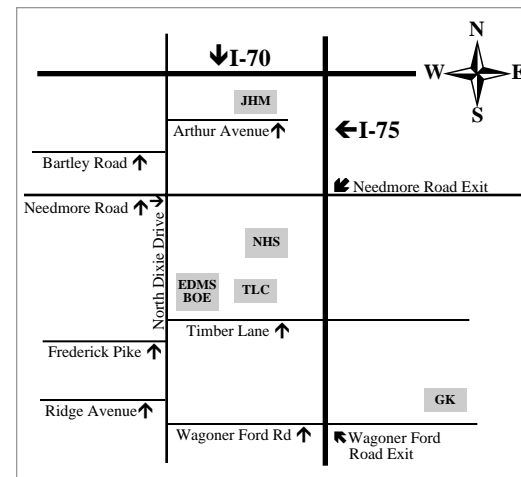

About the District

The Northridge Local Schools, Home of the Polar Bears, is located in Harrison Township, 6 miles north of the City of Dayton. The community has a unique small town feeling in a large town atmosphere. Parents have a strong desire to see their children attain educational goals, and the district serves a rich variety of socio-economic, ethnic, and racial backgrounds.

The school district enrolls approximately 1,750 students, operates an early childhood center for preschool and kindergarten age children, two elementary schools, a middle school, and high school. It has 240 full and part-time employees. Northridge Schools offer a comprehensive academic curriculum, including college preparatory classes, gifted education, vocational programs, and a full range of services in special education. In addition to academic and related services, students may participate in a wide range of co-curricular and extra curricular activities.

Young people and their parents soon discover that opportunities abound for a great school experience in Northridge.



In cooperation with local agencies, the district also offers a Latch Key program for elementary school children. After school and summer programs provide academic intervention and enrichment activities. A family literacy program provides service in adult education and parent/child time together for adults who qualify and who are in need of literacy skills.



From preschool through high school, the Northridge Schools focus on the needs of young people. Enhanced and enriched programs that reach out to the talented, advanced children, are balanced by comprehensive services for the academically, physically, and mentally challenged, ensuring success for all.

Staff and Students

A multi-talented staff of dedicated, educators and administrators provide students with the support, mentoring and leadership necessary for success in school and later in life. This group is complemented by a support staff of cooks, aides, custodians, bus drivers, and secretaries to create a caring and helpful environment.



The Northridge students hail from many diverse backgrounds, but like the community itself, show a united interest and pride in their school. This is readily evident in their achievements and their relationships and empathy for others.



Facilities

With the passage of a bond issue in 2002, the Northridge Schools have "state of the art" facilities for students well as the community. Included are a football stadium, 8 lane track, fitness room, tennis courts, walking trails, baseball /softball stadiums, playground park shelter and middle school gym.

Building renovations and improvements to the infrastructure at all five schools have been completed, including refurbishing of the middle school auditorium and high school cafeteria. Northridge showcases computer labs and laptops with IVDL capability. Because of the tremendous commitment to technology made by the district over the years, Northridge is "second to none" in the Miami Valley when it comes to student access to the latest in technology.
