Open Enrollment for School Year 2024-25

For the seventeenth consecutive year, the Northridge Local School District will open its doors, tuition free, to students residing in other Ohio school districts.

To be a part of the **Northridge Family** stop by to pick up an Interdistrict Open Enrollment Application Packet. **If your child is currently attending through Interdistrict Open Enrollment, you must complete another application for the 2024-2025 school year and return it by Friday, May 24th, with 2 current proofs of residency.**

Both returning and new applications can be picked up at the School Building, 2011 Timber Lane or at the Board of Education, 2008 Timber Lane, starting Monday, April 1st through Friday, May 24th. NO LATE OR INCOMPLETE APPLI-CATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED. Applications are considered on a first come first serve basis. Space is limited, so apply early!

Pre-School Registration FREE Public Preschool for ALL Northridge Residents

Registration Begins April 25th Online ONLY

To be eligible, preschoolers must be 3 or 4 years old and NOT eligible for Kindergarten, be potty trained (no pull-ups), and live in the Northridge Local School District.

Registration can be completed online at **www.northridgeschools.org**, click on Quick Links and then Final Forms **AFTER APRIL 25TH** for school year 2024-2025. There is limited space in each classroom, and there is a morning session and an afternoon session. Children **do not** need to be present at registration, but **will** need to be present at orientation in the fall.




Children who will be five years old on or before August 1, 2024 are eligible to attend kindergarten during the 2024-2025 school year. You will need to upload the following documentation to Final Forms for your student registration:

• Child's birth certificate • Child's immunization records Parent/legal guardian photo ID

• Custody papers, if applicable • Two (2) proofs of residency in the Northridge Local District. Acceptable documents include: rental/lease/mortgage statement, home owner's or renter's insurance declaration page, auto insurance, current property tax bill, utility bill, paycheck or pay stub with address, current bank statement, or voter registration documentation with address. Additionally the bills need to be dated within the past 30 days of the registration date. If you are living with a friend or relative and not on the lease, an affidavit must be completed, notarized, and accompanied with two proofs of residency from whom you are residing. The residency affidavit may be picked up at the school.
