

Clara Barton









Clara Barton was a nurse during the civil war and also the founder of the American Red Cross. Clara helped soldiers in battle and nursed them back to health. She brought the supplies needed out to the fields during 1862. She brought the supplies to Washington, D.C. as that is where Massachusetts soldiers were fighting. She felt like she needed to be the one to help those poor soldiers. She arrived on the fields with her team to help stressed doctors who had too much on her hands.

Cathay Williams was born in Missouri in 1842, a slave until the Civil War. In the war, slaves were forced to work as staff such as nurses and cooks. She worked as a cook and a washwoman. After the Civil war, she had to get financial support. She wanted to join the army. She joined the military under the name William Cathay. Soon after she enlisted, she contracted smallpox, which led to her commanding officer discovering she was a female. She was then honorably discharged due to disability. She is remembered as the first African American woman to join the U.S. Army.





Madam C.J Walker

Madam C.J Walker was the first woman to make over a million dollars. Madam C.J walker invented hair products for African American women. The reason why she made hair products was because she had a skin condition that made her lose her hair. She traveled with her husband around the country selling her products and showing people how to use them. She made her hair products in 1906.



Did you know?

There will be a total solar eclipse over the midwest United States on April 8, 2024. As a result, there is no school on this day.

A solar eclipse happens when the Moon moves between Earth and the Sun. When this happens, the Moon gradually blocks out the light from the Sun.



You can view the eclipse safely by using ISO-certified-safe solar eclipse glasses and viewers, and keep them on while the Sun is not yet fully eclipsed.
Once the sky turns dark, you can take your safety glasses off and see the sun's amazing corona.

ECLIPSE

Dayton, Ohio is in the path of totality. The partial eclipse begins at 1:53 PM and ends at 4:25 PM. The total eclipse begins at 3:09 PM and will last for 2 minutes and 46 seconds.

Starting Saturday, March 23, you can stop by any Fricker's or Grismer Tire and Auto locations throughout the WHIO-TV viewing area, during regular business hours, and receive up to four (4) complimentary sunglasses, while supplies last.
