#### **New Equipment Enhances Career Tech Education**



On Friday, December 6, 2024, Northridge Local Schools took a major step forward in expanding its Advanced Manufacturing program with the delivery and installation of two new Haas machines,

thanks to the generous support of the *Ohio Career Technical Education* (*CTE*) Equipment Grant. Holp & Sons assisted with the delivery and placement of the new Haas TL-1 Toolroom Lathe, Haas VF-3YT Vertical Machining Center, and a Bridgeport milling machine, as well as relocating a third machine to optimize the training facility.

These state-of-the-art machines will provide students with hands-on,

real-world experience in precision machining, preparing them for careers in high-demand fields. The Haas TL-1 Toolroom Lathe, a cutting-edge CNC lathe, offers capabilities such as turning, threading, and facing, making it ideal for both experienced machinists and those new to CNC machining. Vertical machining centers like the Haas VF-3YT are versatile machines used for a



wide range of machining operations, including milling, drilling, tapping, and boring. The Bridgeport milling machine, a classic in metalworking, allows students to perform precision tasks such as cutting, drilling, and shaping materials, ensuring a solid foundation in machining principles.



This investment, supported by the CTE Equipment Grant from the Ohio Department of Education, underscores the district's commitment to preparing students for workforce success. "We are thrilled to receive this grant, which will significantly enhance our career-technical education programs," said Andrea Townsend, Director of Human Resources, Pupil Services, & Communications at Northridge Local Schools. "This funding allows us to equip students with industry-standard tools and experiences that will set them up for thriving careers."




