Students must be 5 years of age by August 1, 2022 to register. Please bring with you:

- Child's original birth certificate
- Child's immunization records
- Custody papers, if applicable Two proofs of residency in the Northridge Local School District. Acceptable items are: rental/lease/mortgage statement, home owner's or renter's insurance declaration page, auto insurance, current property tax bill, utility bill, paycheck or pay stub with address, current bank statement, or voter registration documentation with address. Additionally the bills need to be dated within the past 30 days of the registration date. If you are living with

a friend or relative and are not on the lease, an affidavit must be completed, notarized, and accompanied with two proofs of residency from

whom you are residing.

• Names, addresses, and telephone numbers of adults you plan to place on the emergency contact forms and your child's physicians to place on the medical forms.
