- \* 2 Proofs of Residency (Lease and Utility Bill)
- \* Child's Insurance Card

- \* Parent/Guardian Valid ID
- \* Proof of Income (Last 3 pay stubs of EVERYONE in the home, current OWF/Food Stamps or SSI award letters.)

To be eligible, preschoolers must be 3 or 4 years old and NOT eligible for Kindergarten, be potty trained (no pull-ups), and live in the Northridge Local School District. There is limited space in each classroom, and there is a morning session and an afternoon session. Children do not need to be present at registration, but will need to be present at orientation in the fall. #### **Coming Soon - Kindergarten Registration**



Will your child be 5 years of age by August 1, 2024? If so, it's time to register him/her for kindergarten! *Join us for a Kindergarten Registration Event on Thursday, April 25th at 4:00 p.m.* More specifics will be released as the date draws nearer. In the meantime, gather the following items you will need to bring with you to kindergarten registration:

- Child's original birth certificate
- Child's immunization records
- Custody papers, if applicable
- Photo identification of parent/legal guardian
- Two proofs of residency in the Northridge Local School District. Acceptable items are: rental/lease/mortgage statement, home owner's or renter's insurance declaration page, auto insurance, current property tax bill, utility bill, paycheck or pay stub with address, current bank statement, or voter registration documentation with address. Additionally the bills need to be dated within the past 30 days of the registration date. If you are living with a friend or relative and are not on the lease, an affidavit must be completed, notarized, and accompanied with two proofs of residency from whom you are residing.
- Names, addresses, and telephone numbers of adults you plan to place on the emergency contact forms and your child's physicians to place on the medical forms.
