During halftime, Ogletree was honored on the 50 yard line by



- *two-hour delay* ALL schedules are adjusted two hours. Champions Preschool A.M. Session will be closed. (Breakfast will NOT be served.)
- *closed* **ALL** buildings are closed.

The decision to close and/or delay school is usually broadcast by area TV, radio stations, and the district one-call system by 6:30 a.m. In order to receive the district one-call, please contact your child's school to make sure they have your correct phone number on file.
