Notification of Parent/Student Rights
In Identification, Evaluation, and Educational Placement
Of Individuals with Disabilities

The following is a description of the rights granted by Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 to students with disabilities. The intent of this Federal Law is to keep you fully informed concerning decisions about your child and to inform you of your rights, if you disagree with any of the decisions made by the School District.

K.	A response from the School District to reasonable requests for explanations and interpretations of your child's records;
L.	Request amendment of your child's educational records if there is reasonable cause to believe that they are inaccurate, misleading or otherwise in violation of the privacy rights of your child. If the School District refuses this request for amendment, it shall notify you within a reasonable time, and advise you of the right to a hearing and/or to place in the record a statement of why you disagree with the information it contains;
M.	Request an impartial due-process hearing relating to decisions or actions regarding your child's identification, evaluation or educational placement. You and your child may take part in the hearing and have an attorney represent you. You will also have the opportunity to review any decision made after the hearing has concluded. Ο.	File a complaint/grievance with the U.S. Department of Education Office of Civil Rights at any time;
